Tarr actually started before me. 2002 or 2003. He's unclear, he's had a lot of head trauma. Then he joined the Navy in 2005 and didn't come back until 2019. I started a year after 2006 as a 13 year old.

We trained at the same place next to a weird old sex shop. So I was surrounded by bad people at a young age. I ended up going to Prison in 2019 and I met Tarr after he was dishonourably discharged from the navy. We were doing community service and we've been teaming for about 2 years.

Our main shows are at the Kedron Wavell in Chermside. We've done Eatons Hill. The Banana Bender. We'll fight whoever wherever for the right price. We used to do regular shows at the Zoo which is now Crowbar. We're actually sponsored by TTB fitness. That's how we stay fit.

As for outfits. I only own one set of prison overalls. Tarr has some sexy spandex but he still had some leftover Navy dollarydoos to get his fit. I can't afford to upgrade. We tried to go Instagram famous and it didn't work. So we do very little advertising for the show that's someone else's job.

My favourite show was 4ZZZ RumbleRock 2012. I think there's a few clips still on YouTube of it. We did a 5 on 5 no rules hardcore match with tables, ladders and thumbtacks. I did a suplex off a balcony. It was all kinds of banana. As a team. We did a show in Toowoomba at the Powerhouse, where we stole the door of a disabled toilet, then we slammed a guy through it. And then we left. That was a highlight.



4ZZZ the Beer Show presents... 4ZZZ BEERSTOCK MERRY!

Welcome to Beerstock 2025, a comeback of the 4ZZZ radio station fund raising festival that went from 1997, to 1999 and spin offs of the festival continued into the 2000's.

Words from the 2025 festival organiser Justin Law. "BEERSTOCK was an epic Zed fundraising event that was started in the late 90's by 4ZZZ Beer Show announcers Adam and Scott as part of a push by the station to have niche shows put on events. When they teamed up with Rollo and Club Splurt at the Treasury Hotel, and then the Railway Hotel, it really took off. Huge lineups, free entry, cheap beer and Zed would get a cut of the bar! What could be better. It was epic. The event followed Club Splurt to its various venues over the years and later on after Adam and Scott left the station Rollo continued the event into the 2000's."

"By booking a crapload of bands it gave local bands the opportunity to play bigger gigs with bigger crowds than they would normal perform to. It also raised valuable funds for 4ZZZ-FM. BEERSTOCK 2025 is a tribute to the legacy of BEERSTOCK and a celebration of the contributions of Rollo to 4ZZZ's fundraising events at Club Splurt."

During the 1990's and early 2000's in the Brisbane's music scene, there wasn't much coverage for local bands. The only way they could get noticed was through festivals like The Big Day Out, Livid Festival and Market Day.

4ZZZ radio station has been our first and only underground, non-profit community radio broadcaster and it's the longest-running station in Queensland, launched on December 8th, 1975. While researching for the biography, Rollo: The King of Punk it's a shared commonality between most musicians that were involved in the music scene during when it first gave rise to a culture of live music in Brisbane, they were inspired by bands they heard on 4ZZZ. 4ZZZ connected, inspired people, and it was a response to oppression. Without it we would not have an independent local music scene in Brisbane.

Beerstock was a part of local gigs that was hosted by 4ZZZ that was considered successful because it was able to draw large crowds and raise money for the station.
